Kid's Programs

Bronte Creek Provincial Park has many activities to keep the whole family busy. There is something going on everyday! Updated listings are inserted into this publication and are available at all park offices and facilities. Current program listings are posted on the information boards by the parking lots in the day use area or at the campgrounds' main comfort stations.

Kids Programs - Come with your children to learn about Bronte Creek up close - through an hour of discovery with games, stories and activities.

Adventure Club - Drop your kids off for this program filled with ADVENTURE! - activities may include pond studies, heritage baking, heritage crafts, or

camping skills. Pre-registration recommended, limited spots available for first come, first serve.

For the whole family:

Campfires - Gather round the fire to hear stories, songs and skits about Bronte Creek's natural and human history.

Evening programs - Join a Park Interpreter for an evening filled with interesting facts. The Friday night series will highlight outdoor recreation skills that could include camping, outdoor cooking, wildlife viewing. The Saturday night showcase series will bring in guest speakers with live animals or special performances of the ever popular 'Blast From the Past'.

Guided Walks - (Tyke Hikes and Night Hikes) Join a Park Interpreter on a leisurely outing which focuses on interesting themes of Bronte Creek's natural and human history. Tyke Hikes are specially programmed for pre-school aged-kids with basic information and interactive, sensory activities. For all walks you may wish to bring a hat, sun

block and insect repellent, sturdy walking shoes and water. Please no dogs on the night hikes.

Ask Dolly About - A costumed park interpreter will be performing 1890's household tasks. Drop by to lend a hand or sample tasty treats prepared using heritage methods on a wood fueled stove. Each day of the week is a different topic reflecting farm life typical of a Victorian era.



Explore the world of nature with Dr. Science!

Dr. Science - Join Dr. Science to discover cool facts as you examine the plants and animals that make their home in Bronte Creek Provincial Park. Dr. Science loves to explore the natural world with nets, magnifier, binoculars and buckets.

Fact Pack - You think Dora has a lot of stuff in her backpack, wait until you see our pack! A Park Interpreter may visit your campsite or catch you at the pool and show you all sorts of fascinating items from the fact pack.

"?" The Interpreter - Look for a Park Interpreter at a table near the children's farm or around the pool. Stop by to learn about all kinds of exciting topics. We encourage you to use your senses!

Pets, Pets, Pets

If you have brought your pet to Bronte Creek Provincial Park, there are a few things you need to know:

All pets must be kept on a leash not exceeding 2 metres (6 feet) in length at all times. (except in the 2 designated leash free areas for dogs).

As a pet owner, you are responsible for

preventing your pet from making excessive noise or disturbing others. **DO NOT LEAVE YOUR PET UNATTENDED AT YOUR CAMPSITE or in your car!**

Pets are not allowed in the pool area.

You **MUST** clean up after your pet. It is a Provincial Offence if you do not and you could be charged. See Rules To Guide You.



Be a responsible pet owner, keep dogs on a leash at all times.
