

Rollerblades and Bicycles

What a great way to get around the park! Please remember a few simple rules to ensure your safety. Always ride or blade on the right hand side of the road. Ride or blade in single file Always be aware of the traffic around you
Wear your helmet - it is law for any persons 17years of younger

Where to go and where NOT to go...

Rollerblading equipment is available for rent from the park store.

Try out your new skills on the paved rollerblading path in the day-use area.

Use of bicycles along the Half Moon Valley Trail is not recommended as this trail is not barrier free.

Poison Ivy

Be aware of what you are looking for:

- Three leaves
- Middle leaf has its own stem
- Leaves can have smooth or lobed edges
- Can grow as a ground plant or a vine

Watch out for this plant along trails and road edges. If you would like to get a closer look at poison ivy, come to the campground office or Nature Centre and ask to see our terrarium display.

Be Raccoon-Wise

Ensure all food (including coolers) are locked in your vehicle anytime you are not at your site.

- Never bring or store food into your tent.
- Dispose of garbage daily, in the bins provided.
- Never feed or approach a raccoon. They are wild animals and can be bold, unpredictable and vicious.

Remember, rabid animals normally behave out of character. Raccoons in the park tend to be bold, so evidence of rabies may be more difficult to recognize.

Report any suspect raccoon (or any animal) to park staff immediately. Should you have any concerns about the feeding practices of your fellow campers please notify park staff

Campfire safety

- Build fire in designated fire pit only.
- Place woodpile well away from fire pit.
- Have tinder, kindling and various sizes of wood ready before you light your fire.
- Place a fire starter or small bundle of tinder in the centre of the fire pit.
- Place a few pieces of kindling in a tee-pee style over the fire starter.
- Light the fire starter, adding progressively larger pieces of wood, only when fire is well established.
- Campfire flames should not reach more than 1.5 feet off the ground.
- Never leave a campfire unattended.
- Put out your fire completely when you leave the site or retire for the evening.
- Pour 2-3 buckets of water in the fire a little at a time. Be careful of smoke and steam. Stir coals between buckets to ensure that all hot spots are out.



Add larger pieces of wood when fire is well established.
