Program Name	Curriculum and Topic	Location	Length
<b>Soils in the Environment</b>	<p><b>Earth and Space Systems</b> - investigate the components of various soils, and describe the effects of moving water on these soils.</p> <p>Get a closer look into the life under the ground. Identify living things found in the soil, and see how nature is the original recycler. Uses of soil discussed.</p>	Nature Centre Indoor	1 hour
<b>Discovery Tour</b>	<p><b>Life Systems</b> Discover the natural side of Bronte Creek Provincial Park through this slide show and centre tour. Take a closer look at Ontario's unique wildlife including: snakes, turtles, toads and honeybees.</p>	Nature Centre Indoor	1/2 hour
<b>Farm Child</b>	<p><b>Heritage and Citizenship – Pioneer Life</b> - Explain how the pioneers (early farming) used natural resources. - Describe lifestyles of males and females in 1899 and the roles of people in a farming community.</p> <p>Students get a chance to experience a taste of early farming life through hands on activities that may include butter making, carding wool, artifact detective and toys and games.</p>	Spruce Lane Farmhouse Indoor	1 hour
<b>House Tour</b>	<p><b>Heritage and Citizenship – Pioneer Life</b> - describe lifestyles of males and females in 1899 and the roles of people in a farming community.</p> <p>Tour the 1890's farmhouse and see how much things have changed!</p>	Spruce Lane Farmhouse Indoor	1/2 hour
<b>Maple Syrup</b>	<p><b>Canada and World Connections – Urban and Rural Communities</b> Describe the interaction between people &amp; environment. Identify products Ontario sells.</p> <p><b>Heritage and Citizenship – Pioneer Life</b> Compare past and present techniques of processing products. Students will explore historical methods of maple syrup production pre-1900. During the program students will measure and tap a tree and learn how sap is collected, then made into syrup or sugar.</p>	Breckon Shelter Outdoor	1 hour
