



# Bronte Creek

## A little background:

Established in 1972, but did not open gates to public until 1975.

Annual visitation close to 400 000

Recreational Class Park – with day-use facilities and Camping. 2 separate entrances off Burloak and Bronte Road.

682.8 hectares (1690 acres)

## Significant Park Features:

1. The Bronte Creek valley vegetation- landform complex is the least disturbed and most continuous river valley system to occur on the southward sloping shale plains north of Lake Ontario.
2. Regionally significant cross-section of a buried river valley and a number of locally significant earth science features.
3. The park resources include provincially significant archaeological and historical features that range in chronology from archaic to post-European contact.
4. The valley is a Provincial Area of Natural & Scientific Interest (ANSI) because of its earth & life sciences.
